




What are we going to do?

“our city” course)




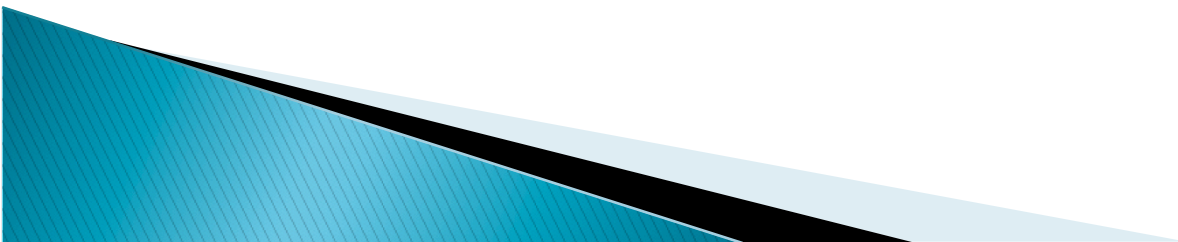
What are we going to do?

- ▶ Build a sharing bridge between China and New Zealand




Why are we doing this?

- ▶ After the Sichuan earthquake, large number of people there were forced to move away and became migrant workers.



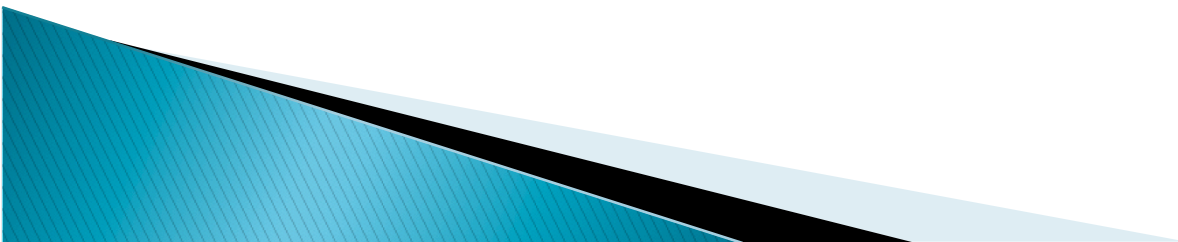
How are we going to do?
