Introduction

- Project grew out of the shared experiences of UNESCO youth forum participants;
- Common thread of disaster experiences:
 - Lack of disaster preparedness;
 - Lack of understanding of disaster risk;
 - Lack of community education.

Observation

- The wisdom gained by people through their personal disaster experience is quickly forgotten or lost:
 - Queensland Floods Traditional "Queenslander" style home on poles vs. modern brick homes built at ground level;
 - Sri Lanka Tsunami 100m buffer zone from the shore is already being developed.

Project Objective

- To create a globally accessible website or webpage that shares the experiences and learnings of young disaster survivors;
- To create a tool that can be used by education providers to raise disaster awareness and preparedness levels in children and youth;
- To create an online forum for children and youth that highlights disaster risk in their region.

Project Outline

- Children and youth share their stories of survival which are uploaded to the web;
- Linked through an interactive map, the stories form a global resource to raise awareness and remind us of lessons learnt.
