What is resilience?


Our defintion of resilence is:

- The ability of communities to be self-reliant


Why?

Disaster resilience needs:


- Pre- (support other members of network)

- Communities need support at all stages




Creating a support network where people can collaborate on individual projects, in individual communities, with shared passion and expertise






