Introduction of sexual assault

Sexual abuse is any type of sexual activity that a person does not agree to, such as:

- Inappropriate touching or molestation
- Sexual intercourse without one's agreement
- Forcible sodomy or sexual penetration with an inanimate object
- Forcing someone unwilling to touch another's intimate part

Factors involved in sexual assault

Age

- Consumption of alcohol or drugs
- Having multiple sexual partners
- Involvement in sex work
 - Poverty

Statistics

- 80% of female prisoners were victims of childhood physical or sexual abuse.
- 44% of victims are under the age of 18.
- 80% are under the age of 30.
- 60% of sexual assaults are not reported to the police.
- 15 out of 16 rapists will never be jailed.
- Approximately 2/3 of assaults are committed by someone known to the victim.
- 38% of rapists are a friend or acquaintance

Effects on the victims

- Shock
- Fear
- Depression
- Phobia
- Sexually transmitted diseases
- Lack of self confidence

Malaysian policies

- Before 2007, Malaysia's law did not prosecute husbands who sexually assaulted their wives.
- On September 2007, a new subsection of the law was formed and it states that, "Any man who during the subsistence of a valid marriage causes hurt or fear of death, or hurt to his wife or any other person in order to have sexual intercourse with his wife shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to five years".
