- 2. One article per country must be placed every two months. However, the editors of this blog may change the rule to one article per month depending on the volume of articles being sent.
- 3. The country coordinators will review all articles and content submitted by LBD Youth Delegate writers before it will be published. However, once published, the blog editors claim no ownership to the views held by the one who submitted the content or article.
- 4. Each blog entry shall be properly cited with the name of the one who generated that online article.
