Youth compromise over billions of people and millions of them live in violence-and-conflict affected environment. Ethnic diversity, as well religious, economic, social and political differences, create multiple barriers within societies, which most often fail to respond to the needs of young people. In this absence of opportunities and participation, youth become vulnerable and many times stay caught in vicious cycle of violence and stigmatization.

In the other worlds, much contemporary thinking on youth and conflict tends to be overly negative. The young vacillate between two extremes of "infantilizing" and "demonizing". On the other hand, youths are viewed as vulnerable, powerless and in need of protection. On the other, they are feared as dangerous, violent, apathetic and as threats to security. They are subjected to stereotyping images of being angry, drugged and as a threat.

Therefore, recent literature on youth societies marks a shift in thinking about youth. It underlines the perspective, and acknowledges the importance of making the connection between the young and peacebuilding for transforming a predominantly negative discourse on the role of the youths in societies in raising peace.

Problem Statement
