Highest Dropout Rate in the World

- ***Pakistan has one of the highest school dropout rates in the world, thanks to corporal punishment. According to an Islamabad-based NGO, beatings at school are considered culturally acceptable to ensure obedience, and legislation banning this practice is hence poorly implemented. (qtd. In Irin)***



Why not this way?



- ⌘ The objective for this year (2012) is to spread the concept that beating is bad in Pakistan students.
- ⌘ To build a relationship with the Pakistan Board of education, UNESCO and UNICEF.
- ⌘ Contact peace organizations who resist this practice and try to communicate the action plan with them and ask them to cooperate in the plan with us.
- ⌘ Get funding organizations and mediate for the children which have dropped out from school.
- ⌘ Acknowledge the situation in Pakistan and form a new committee and groups in Karachi and other parts of Sindh (One of the states in Pakistan)
- ⌘ Personally go to local homeless students and teach them I.T. skills

Who to Contact in schools?




In the beginning first approach the High School and Fresh University students.
