INTRODUCTION

Project Background

There are 6 millions youth, 60% of total population, in Cambodia. And legalized voters are about 8 millions and 4 million out of 8 millions voter are youth, 18s to 35s. Generally, Cambodian youth doesn't care about social activity and participation at all, only a few hundred of youth were participating in social building in term of politic, economic and humanity etc. A recent report showed that 96% of Cambodian youth know and like alcoholic drinks and numbers of violations are increasing in Cambodia community. We knew that in order to make numbers go down, we have to educate youths about peace concept both in their head and heart through many means such as human rights, formal and informal education, philosophy teaching, religion, culture, impact of violation and conflict as well.

Project Objectives

- Raising awareness on peace among Cambodian youths.
- Increasing participation of youths in society development.
- Building network among youths through create tiny clubs for any each particular issues in their community.
- Reducing violation and problem makers.
- Raising awareness of their necessity responsibility for their generation and beloved mother land, Kingdom of Cambodia.
- Recruit youths into UNESCO Cambodia Youth Peace Ambassador Club (UNESCO-CYPAC).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Time Expectations

Project will be conducted from mid 2011 to the end of 2015, 4 years and half, in order to participate in achieving Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) 2015. One training course takes one month, 4 weekends on every Saturday and Sunday. So there are 58 courses will be conducted.

Eligible Candidates

The program will target youths in 100 high schools and 30 public-private universities students in Phnom Penh Capital

Selection Strategy

The program will select participant or trainee through two steps:

- 1st: Select shortlist application by considering on social activity and school background etc.
- 2nd: Interview those who have been selected by focusing on their commitment, characteristic, vision, and philosophical reflection to their community and society as well.

Course Modules

There are at least 4-8 modules will be put on the list such as:

01. Leadership and Peace
02. Education and Peace
03. Religion and Peace
04. Culture and Peace
05. Peace Reflection through field visits

06. Building project and action plan
