## **Problem Statement**

Violence against women (VAW) appears as one of the country's pervasive social problems. According to the 2008 National Demographic and Health survey conducted by the National Statistics Office, one in five Filipino women age 15-49 has experienced physical violence since age 15. It is indeed alarming that despite efforts to address concern, VAW persists.

Barangay 37, Bitano, Legazpi City as the target beneficiary of the extension programs of the Department of Peace Studies is actually one of the barangay in the City with the most number of Violence Against Women (VAW) cases. In fact, it places third, during the first quarter of 2017.
